71% The percentage of Missouri Housing Development Commission (MHDC) projects that met the Minority participation goals due to the Emerging Business Initiative developed by the City NAACP and the Director of MHDC; MHDC incentivized \$279-Million in projects in 2014 and \$284-Million in 2015.

The percentage of new jobs at IKEA filled by African-Americans; working in partnership with SLATE, 57% the City NAACP assisted in oversight of the developer's compliance with First Source hiring goals for the project.

The number African-Americans hired at Ballpark Village; SLATE & the City NAACP oversaw the developer's compliance with First Source hiring goals for the project. There were a total of 1,577 new hires for the project, 542 were City residents, 596 were county residents, and 419 were Illinois

residents.

advocated for studies at MSD, St. Louis City, and the St. Louis Community College District.
